Foster Program FAQ's

What is an animal foster parent/family?

An animal foster parent/family provides temporary, in-home care for Pit Bulls/Bully Breeds prior to adoption. Providing a foster home is a fantastic and special way to contribute to rescuing abused, neglected, and homeless pets.

Who should foster?

Someone who cannot, at the moment, adopt a pet for its entire lifetime. Foster parents should love animals and have room to welcome them while the animal waits for a permanent home.

Why are pet foster parents needed?

Local animal rescue groups have to turn away dozens of adoptable animals each week because they do not have enough foster parents. Not only do foster parents maximize the number of animals rescued, they also help to care for animals that would be difficult to care for in a shelter or kennel environment: puppies who are not strong enough to fight germs, orphaned puppies, animals recovering from major surgery, or dogs needing one-on-one behavior rehabilitation, socialization, or a break from the shelter environment.

How long would I keep a foster animal?

The length of time a foster home is needed depends on the reason for fostering. Typically, dogs stay in a foster home for 4 weeks to 3 months. There are other circumstances that may require a dog to stay in foster care for an extended period of time.

Can I choose a particular animal to foster?

Our primary goal is to find loving, permanent homes for our animals. You will be able to choose what kind of foster animal would be best suited for you and your home environment.

I already own an animal. Can I still foster?

Before you bring your foster animal home, consult with your veterinarian to make sure your own pets are up-to-date on their vaccinations. NOBBR requires all household pets to be spayed/neutered, UTD on Distemper (DHLPP), Rabies and Bordetella.

If I fall in love, can I adopt my foster animal?

Yes. Foster parents make up a large percentage of our forever homes. You can, however, save many more lives if you are able to return your foster animal and take another who is in need of a temporary home.

What else should I be prepared to do as a pet foster parent, does it cost money?

The foster homes serve as a bridge to life in a new forever home. Foster homes will be required to get their foster to adoption events as well as medical appointments. NOBBR will provide you with the proper size crate for the length of the foster term, NOBBR policy is that all foster homes utilize crate training methods. NOBBR also provides premium food/treats, quality routine vet care, and monthly flea and heartworm prevention, all we ask is that you open your home and heart to one of our deserving dogs.
